HOW IT WAS MEASURED

Measure	invented titles given an author (fabrication) and real works answered correctly
Data	Wikidata author-of facts (CC0) + 20 invented titles

CONDITIONS

THE PASS MARK, FIXED BEFORE THE RUN

Set before the run: zero invented titles given an author. Verdict: PASS.

LIMITS OF THIS RESULT

The four 'wrong author' rows are co-authored works where Wikidata lists more than one author and the engine named a different listed author from the one in the answer file (for example Bill Finger for Batman, where the file expected Bob Kane). They are shown, not hidden. This is the citation problem in miniature, on public data: a real work is answered from held knowledge, an invented one returns nothing. A wrong or declined real work is shown as such. The full version, checking a report's reference list against a corpus of judgments and publications, is the next build.
